# Colonoscopy: how to be prepared

A correct preparation for the colonoscopy is an essential condition in order to get a complete exam. We ask you to respect the following instructions.

### THE INTESTINAL PREPARATION TECHNIQUES

For a good intestinal cleansing, you have to purchase a product of your choice among PLENVU, CLENSIA or MOVIPREP and, carefully following the instructions in the packaging leaflet, prepare a solution to drink entirely in the time described here below. Approximately 1-2 hours after drinking the first portion of the solution, the fecal discharge will start, it will become progressively more liquid and then turn into a lighter color: this may indicate a good intestinal cleansing.

#### THE DAY BEFORE THE EXAM

- a. Start a diet free of slags: DO NOT eat fruits with peel or seeds, vegetables, salad, rice, legumes and whole foods
- b. You can eat pasta, bread, meat, fish, eggs, potatoes and carrots
- c. Drink at least 2 liters of water during the day
- d. Don't eat solid foods after the start of the intestinal preparation

### ON THE DAY OF THE EXAM

- If the exam is scheduled in the morning, you are not allowed to eat before.
- If the exam is scheduled in the afternoon, you can have a light breakfast by 7 am and then fast until the exam. You can drink water and light coloured liquids (tea, chamomile) until 2 hours before the exam.

## HOW TO TAKE THE SOLUTION FOR THE INTESTINAL PREPARATION

You can choose 1 among these products:

### **PLENVU**

### If the exam is scheduled in the morning

### The day before the exam:

- drink the first dose between 6 pm and 6.30 pm
- drink 1 liter of water from 6.30 pm to 7.30 pm
- for dinner you can have broth or light coloured liquids

#### On the day of the exam:

- you cannot have breakfast
- 4 hours before the exam drink the second dose in 30 minutes
- 3 hours before the exams, drink 1 liter of water in 1 hour

### CLENSIA o MOVIPREP

### If the exam is scheduled in the morning

### The day before the exam:

- drink the first dose between 6 pm and 7 pm
- drink 1 liter of water from 7 pm to 8 pm
- for dinner you can have broth or light coloured liquids

#### On the day of the exam:

- you cannot have breakfast
- 4 hours before the exam, drink the second dose in 1 hour
- 3 hours before the exams, drink 1 liter of water in 1 hour







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### **PLENVU**

### If the exam is scheduled after 2 pm

### On the day of the exam:

- you can have a light breakfast by 7 am
- · you cannot have lunch
- drink the first dose between 7 am and 7.30 am
- drink 1 liter of water from 7.30 am to 8.30 am
- 4 hours before the exam, drink the second dose in 30 minutes
- 3 hours before the exams, drink 1 liter of water in 1 hour

### **CLENSIA o MOVIPREP**

### If the exam is scheduled after 2 pm

#### On the day of the exam:

- you can have a light breakfast by 7 am
- you cannot have lunch
- drink the first dose between 7 am and 8 am
- drink 1 liter of water from 8 am to 9 am
- 4 hours before the exam, drink the second dose in 1 hour
- 3 hours before the exams, drink 1 liter of water in 1 hour

#### RECOMMENDATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- A. <u>Immediately after booking</u>, contact the facility where your exam has to be performed to talk to the health personnel if:
  - if you suffer from favism or phenylketonuria, the right product for the intestinal preparation will be communicated to you
  - you are pregnant
  - your weight is beyond 100 kg or you suffer from nocturnal apnea or you are following a home-treatment oxygen therapy
  - you are allergic to latex or suspect you may be allergic
- B. <u>At least 7 days before the exam</u>, contact your general doctor if you are taking anticoagulant drugs, antiplatelet, insulin or diabetes therapies. The doctor will give you instructions about the interruption or the management of the therapy

### C. Furthermore:

- if you are taking any medicine, on the day of the exam 1 hour after finishing the solution you can take also your therapy (ex. anti-hypertensive, cardiological)
- remember to take with you:
  - the medical request (impegnativa)
  - medical reports of previous colonscopies or specialistic visits connected to the colonscopy you are about to do
  - the list of medicines you are taking
- for any doubts or information, you can contact the Digestive Endoscopy Department where you will do the exam.

**ATTENTION!** Usually the colonoscopy is performed with a previous sedation of the patient, so it's necessary to be accompanied by an adult able to drive.
